Parental Reminders Cycle Permit Form

Children in Year 6 and Year 5 (after completing Bikeability) are eligible to cycle to and from school alone. In deciding whether your child is ready to cycle to school, we recommend that you work with your child/ren to build up their independence through route finding, road safety skills and general awareness.

Riding a bike has many benefits. Staying active improves physical fitness: it improves cardiovascular health, strengthens bones and muscles, and helps kids improve their motor skills, balance and coordination. Cycling is also good for kids, mental health as it is a great way to reduce stress and anxiety and improve mood and self-esteem. This often means students who cycle to school are more relaxed, happier and better prepared to start the day



All children in Year 5 & Year 6 have been provided with a Cycle Permit Form, if your child is currently cycling to school or if you would like your child to commence cycling to school, please could you kindly complete the form provided and return this to the school office. Thank you.
